



SFLA Sponsored Survey Results: Catholics and Evangelicals and the 2008 Presidential Election

National Survey Conducted to Gauge Catholic and Evangelical Views on 2008 Presidential Election

Today, Students for Life of America and The Catholic Association have released survey results from a joint survey conducted from August 12-22 to gauge Catholic and Evangelicals views on the 2008 Presidential Election. *(Please note this survey is different from the Students for Life of America Presidential Candidate Survey conducted in August. Results from that survey will be released in September.)*

The objective of the survey was to see where Catholics and Evangelicals stood on important election issues and find out how they currently viewed the issue stances of the 2 presidential candidate front runners.

The survey showed Senator McCain leading Senator Obama among religiously-active Catholics and Evangelicals. However, Senator McCain's lead is significantly smaller than President George W. Bush's in the 2004 election.

The survey also showed that there are four issues that have the potential to change the current voting intentions of religiously-active Catholics and Evangelicals. Three of those four issues involve the pro-life movement.

- Same-Sex Marriage
- Restrictions on Abortion
- The Infants Born-Alive Protection Act
- Judicial Appointments
